

7 SHAPE SORTING

- 1 With a partner, cut out 3-D pictures of groceries from a supermarket flier or copy and paste pictures from an online store into a document.
- 2 Sort the pictures into groups.
- 3 Paste **each group** onto a larger piece of paper.

You could put all the cuboid-shaped packages on one page.



- 4 Choose **one** grocery item and describe it by how it looks.
(You are not allowed to name the product or say what it is used for.)
- 5 Your partner must try to guess what group the item is from.

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
