Make these groups of 10 on the abacus or by drawing an array.

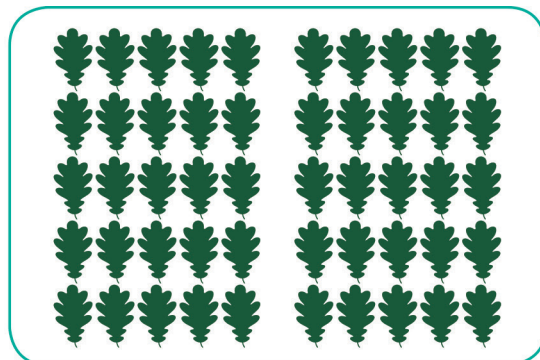
Fill in the missing numbers.

b



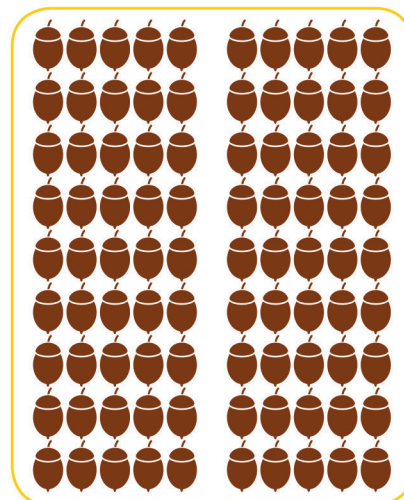
$5 \times 10 = \underline{\quad}$ so $\underline{\quad} \times 5 = \underline{\quad}$
