

Brainstorm of ideas

- A researcher is planning to write a book comparing teenagers in different countries. She wants to find out everything she can about their habits, interests, physical attributes, etc.



- sticky notes or small pieces of paper

- 1 Individually brainstorm at least ten ideas for survey topics that the researcher could investigate. Put **one** idea on each sticky note in **large** print and display them on the wall.
- 2 As a group, discuss the ideas that you all came up with. Try to improve and join ideas together to make better ones.
- 3 As a group, choose the five best ideas.
- 4 Present the ideas to the class and answer any questions the class might have about them. Improve the ideas if possible.
- 5 As a class, vote on the top five ideas from the whole class.



You could choose to use multi voting. Give each person in the group three votes that they can place in any way they like. This could be all on one idea or spread between the ideas.
